Overview

This volume focuses attention on the cooperative effects between cells that underlie antibody formation and delayed hypersensitivity. The immune response is dependent upon the interaction of several cell types, including thymus-dependent cells which play a role in delayed hypersensitivity, transplantation immunity, and other aspects of cellular immunity, and thymus-independent cells which act either independently or in association with thymus-derived cells to produce humoral antibody. This example, as well as others described in the volume, demonstrates that the immune response consists of a chain of events in which activity of one cell type modifies or induces the activity of another.
