Only three price advances have been made by us since 1934, i.e. on June 25, 1940, because of advance in cost of sheet glass, on Oct. 25, 1940, because of advance in rate of war risk insurance, and on Feb. 15, 1941, because of further advances both in the cost of the glass and in insurance rates. *We have made no advances because of scarcity.*
